


President's Message



Project partners also include the Scott Cowen Institute for Public Education Initiative at Tulane University and Loyola Law School.

Lawyer's Challenge for Children

The Louisiana Bar Foundation established the Children's Legal Services Fund to provide special grants to non-profit organizations giving children access to special education and health-care services, mental health and foster care services. Additionally, the fund provides support for advocacy in administrative and legal proceedings and impacts litigation and systemic legal reform on behalf of children. With this dedicated funding, the LBF hopes to energize a statewide network of legal assistance to mentally and physically disabled children, children in the foster system, children in the juvenile justice system, and children who are not receiving the minimum access to educational services required by law.
