# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: 2020-21 President Harry J. "Skip" Philips, Jr.



t is my pleasure to report to you on the activities of the LBF and a challenging yet amazing year.

For more than 30 years, the LBF has been a trusted authority and the state's largest funder of civil legal aid. Our decades of experience as a responsible steward of funds, along with our well-established partnerships

across all 64 parishes, has allowed us to help hundreds of thousands of Louisiana residents gain access to the legal system.

We partner with a trusted network of more than 70 grantees that are leading community-driven efforts to help families on the ground with their specific challenges. Civil legal aid is a vital component of our state's response to, and recovery from, the current public health crisis. Our goal is to make sure that all Louisianans, regardless of their zip code, background, or income level, have access to the civil legal services that they need.

Through no fault of their own, more families find themselves qualifying for civil legal aid, and more civil legal issues are surfacing. As the number of Louisiana citizens eligible for civil legal aid increases, this funding will diminish.

This year we awarded more than \$8.3 million in grants for social justice initiatives in the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

During this ever-changing and challenging year, we made great strides. In January, we unveiled the findings of our 2020 Economic Impact and Social Return on Investment of Civil Legal Aid Services for Louisiana. The SROI analysis completed for Louisiana's civil legal aid organizations measures the values delivered during fiscal year 2019-20. The Analysis revealed that the net economic impact value resulting from Louisiana civil legal activities during the year totaled \$64,823,000. These values are based on the number of clients and types of legal matters handled during the period. Louisiana's civil legal aid organizations helped in over 100 types of civil legal problems, including family law, housing, healthcare, consumer protection, public benefits, employment, and community support issues.

The total net social return on investment for Louisiana's civil legal aid programs during the 2019-20 fiscal year was 918%. In other words, for every \$1 invested in Louisiana's civil legal

aid services, these programs deliver \$9.18 in immediate and long-term consequential financial benefits.

We continue to serve as the fiscal administrator for the Child In Need of Care Program in partnership with the Louisiana Supreme Court and the Department of Child and Family Services. Last fiscal year, the program served 4,008 children, made 14,498 court appearances on their behalf, and participated in nearly 1,450 family team conferences.

#### **DEVELOPMENT**

To provide a path for continuing its mission, specifically with respect to the Loan Repayment Assistance Program (LRAP), the Kendall Vick Public Law Foundation transitioned to the Kendall Vick Public Law Fund, a \$3 million restricted fund of the LBF in December 2020. LRAP provides direct financial assistance to public interest attorneys and helps retain committed lawyers who provide quality services to clients. The LBF is grateful for the opportunity to continue the mission of the Kendall Vick Foundation and to provide financial assistance to public interest attorneys committed to helping our communities.

The newly established Infinity Fund is designed to provide long-term support for the operation and administrative expenses of LBF. Donations will help ensure that the Foundation is able to meet staffing and other operational expenses, in good economic times and in bad. The Infinity Fund is a dedicated fund for the specific purpose of staff and operational expenses.

In February, several of our past presidents joined us on a zoom meeting where we updated them on LBF activities. The Past Presidents Advisory Council was established in 2017 to engage LBF past presidents and utilize their institutional knowledge and leadership abilities.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

The current Fellows Class Project focuses on Connecting Legal Needs to Education in partnership with Louisiana Appleseed and Lagniappe Law Lab. The Fellows Class Project is a way for new Fellows to become involved and be a part of the LBF mission.

In October and November, we held the POP UP Tour. We hosted nine regional CLE webinars, "Why the LBF is Good for the Profession," focusing on civil legal aid and how the need is increasing. The POP UP WRAP UP virtual networking event included a panel that featured local and national journalists, discussions on how the LBF operates, hot topics

for grantees, and a legal community huddle.

We continue to partner with Spitfire Strategies to help us increase the visibility and understanding of the need for basic civil legal aid services for those who cannot afford them. Spitfire has a long history of working with advocacy organizations and foundations and brings decades of policy, nonprofit and Foundation leadership experience, and insight; together, we plan to spark change for the entire Louisiana civil legal aid network.

#### **EDUCATION**

This year we launched the new program, "Speak Out for Justice! Focus on Civil Legal Aid." We plan to engage multiple content creators who will develop a public awareness-focused or a research-focused project for the LBF to increase understanding of the need for civil legal aid services.

#### **GRANTS**

In February and March, we hosted Regional Grantee Staff and Board Training sessions. These training events aimed to strengthen grantee leadership by reviewing board member responsibilities, setting program and administration priorities for the organization, identifying current client service trends and best practices, and evaluating mission goals and outcomes. Training topics included governance, communications, and diversity.

The department provides ongoing support for grantees, including basic training for new executive directors. Unique for this year, the department is working with the law schools to unify their loan repayment assistance programs into one under the LBF.

#### **TECHNOLOGY**

Exciting progress in being made through technology to provide additional resources to our grantees. The Louisiana Civil Legal Navigator launched in October and currently supports four areas of law - divorce, child custody, private landlord-tenant law, and unpaid wages. The Navigator, an LBF funded project of Lagniappe Law Lab, directs Louisiana's low-income and underserved communities to the most appropriate resources within the civil legal aid network.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN

In October, the board and staff met to recalibrate our Strategic Plan creating a new vision for 2023.

#### **FINANCE AND INVESTMENTS**

The LBF applied for and received SBA Paycheck Protection Program loans for the first and second rounds totaling \$358,857 (\$177,000 round 1 and \$181,857 round 2). Forgiveness has been received for the first round of funding.

We added the Investment Committee, which oversees \$12,799,018.06 in managed funds (as of 3/31/2021); implemented quarterly meetings with Hancock Whitney trust management team; and updated the LBF spending and reserve policy to ensure long term financial stability of the organization and funding for grantees.

The committee also continues to do ongoing compliance reviews of financial institutions in the IOLTA program.

#### **GOVERNANCE**

In July, we approved a policy establishing a schedule to review all pertinent governance documents. The schedule identifies different documents each year for review by the committee resulting in all documents being reviewed every five years.

An amendment to the By-Laws Article VIII was approved to reflect all standing committees with descriptions, members, reporting, and participation guidelines.

An accounting policy and procedure manual was developed and approved containing comprehensive internal financial practices.

The committee implemented an annual review of all organization insurance coverages to ensure adequate coverages and limit the risk of liability.

#### **STAFF**

We have also been busy adding new staff. We hired new Finance Director Cassie Holcomb. Cassie manages the financial activities of the organization, including tracking cash flow and financial planning, general accounting, managing finance staff, as well as analyzing financial strengths and weaknesses, and proposing corrective actions.

Thanks to all of you who contribute to the important work of the Bar Foundation. It has been my great privilege to be a part of this dynamic organization.

The 2020 SROI analysis completed for Louisiana's civil legal aid organizations is a measurement of the values delivered during the fiscal year 2019-20.

The Analysis revealed that the net economic impact value resulting from Louisiana civil legal activities during the year totaled \$64,823,000.

This net impact is the outcome of the more than \$7 million LBF granted for civil legal aid services. These values are based on the number of clients and types of legal matters handled during the period. In fiscal year 2019-20, Louisiana's civil legal aid organizations helped in over 100 types of civil legal problems including family law, housing, healthcare, consumer protection, public benefits, employment, and community support issues.

This study was released in January 2021.

Exciting progress in being made through technology to provide additional resources to our grantees. The Louisiana Civil Legal Navigator launched in October and currently supports four areas of law - divorce, child custody, private landlord-tenant law, and unpaid wages. The Navigator, an LBF funded project of Lagniappe Law Lab, directs Louisiana's low-income and underserved communities to the most appropriate resources within the civil legal aid network. Following the nine webinars, we hosted a virtual WRAP UP networking event which included a panel featuring local and national journalists, discussions on how the LBF operates, hot topics for grantees, and a legal community huddle.



Speak Out for Justice! Focus on Civil Legal Aid is a new program of the LBF's Education Committee. #### **2020 DISTINGUISHED JURIST**

#### **Guy P. Holdridge**

Judge Guy P. Holdridge serves on the First Circuit Court of Appeal. Judge Holdridge previously served as a District Judge of the 23rd Judicial District Court. He served as a district court judge since 1991 and chief judge numerous times. Judge Holdridge earned a B.A. Degree from Louisiana State University in 1974 and a J.D. in 1978 from the LSU Law Center where he was a member of the Order of the Coif and the Louisiana Law Review. While in law school, he had two of his articles published in the Law Review. He is a member of the LSU Law Center Hall of Fame.



Judge Holdridge serves on the adjunct faculty of LSU Law Center where he teaches LA Civil Procedure. He is on the committee for the LSU Trial Advocacy Program. Judge Holdridge is the 2021 editor of the Louisiana Code of Civil Procedure published by Thomson Reuters. He is a long-time member of the council of the Louisiana Law Institute and is now serving as the Director of the Institute. He is also a member of the Childrens Code, Child Custody, Expropriation, Prescription, Bail Bonds, Summary Judgment, Civil Procedure, Recusal, and Adult Guardianship Committees of the Law Institute. He is the past reporter of the Expedited Jury Trial Committee, Summary Judgment, and Bail Bonds Committees. He is also currently serving as the acting reporter for the Criminal Law and Procedure. He is a past president of the Louisiana District Judges Association, a member of the Executive Committee and a

past Chairman of the District Judges Best Practices Committee and led the effort to have Judges Bench Books

He was also part of the mentoring program of the District Judges Association. He is the past President of the First Circuit Judges Association. #### **PROFESSOR DONALD W. NORTH**

Vice Chancellor Donald W. North, Colonel North, the Johnny Cochran Endowed Law Professor at Southern University Law Center (SULC) received his Associate Degree in Criminal Justice and Bachelors Degree in Political Science from Grambling State University. He received his Juris Doctorate Degree from the Southern University Law Center in 1983.

Vice Chancellor North accepted a commission in the Army ROTC Program where he was first branched as a military police officer before being selected as an officer to join the Judge Advocate Generals Corp. He is currently retired from the United States Army, where he received numerous acknowledgments and awards. He is one of the first African American



Louisiana Army Judge Advocate General Reservists to be promoted to the rank of Full Colonel.

After serving active on duty during Desert Storm One, Professor North returned to Louisiana to serve as a prosecutor in the Criminal Division of the Louisiana Department of Justice, handling cases in all 64 Louisiana parishes.

In 1998 he was offered a position as a Clinical Professor at SULC, before becoming Director of Clinical Education. Professor North left the Law Clinic in 2013 to become the Director of the Pro Bono Project. In 2015 he began serving as the Director of Experiential Learning and in 2019 Professor North was promoted to Vice Chancellor of Student Affairs.

#### Hon. William J. Knight

Judge William J. Rusty Knight began his legal career in 1976. He graduated from LSU Law School where he was Order of the Coif and a member of the Louisiana Law Review. He was an associate with Hudson, Potts, and Bernstein in Monroe, LA from 1976-1979.

He then served as an Assistant District Attorney for Washington and St. Tammany Parishes from 1979-1985. After that tenure, he opened a private law practice, handling both civil and criminal matters. In January 2003, he took office as district judge of the 22nd Judicial District Court, Division J. Judge Knight has presided over juvenile and child in need of care proceedings and a section of adult Drug Court, in addition to his civil and criminal dockets.

Most recently, Judge Knight worked to establish the 22nd Judicial
District Courts ReEntry Court. In November 2015, the Louisiana Supreme
