Louisiana Bar Foundation is the State's largest funder of civil legal aid. We partner with a trusted network of more than 70 organizations that lead community driven efforts to help families facing non-criminal, civil legal challenges. Since 1989 the LBF has granted more than \$111 million in grants to help people across a wide range of issues, including assistance for veterans and military families, domestic violence, senior and elderly services, child welfare services, housing, and unemployment.

Access to Justice Fund Grants

\$50,000

Promotes administration of justice and benefit Louisiana's statewide justice community. Initiatives for consideration must meet a least one of the following criteria:

The advancement and maintenance of statewide technology
The coordination of statewide intake and referral
Disaster or emergency response.

Child in Need of Care (State/Federal)

\$3,420,000

Through Acadiana Legal Services and Southeast Louisiana Legal Services this funding provides free legal representation to children in need of care, foster care and non-custodial.

Children's Legal Services

Helps to provide legal assistance to needy children in areas of law which affect their safety, well-being, and future development.

Special Program and Project Funding \$653,000
